Mangaung confers 43 Road Traffic Management certificates

angaung Metro conferred certificates to 43 new traffic enforcers on Friday, 05 December 2014 after a year-long programme hosted by the city.

The new graduates studied for an NQF Level Four certificate in Road Traffic Management, and represented three provinces: Free State, North West and Kwa-Zulu Natal.

"This qualification gives them a broad knowledge and skills for a career in road traffic," said HoD of Corporate Service Me Mpatliseng Ramaema.

Although the training took a year, MMC for Transport and Security Cllr Moses Sekakanyo reminded the graduates that their field of work is one of "lifetime education, service and leadership".

In his address to the graduates, their family members and Mangaung officials, the MMC emphasised that when they start working in their respective towns, they must not fall into the fold of corrupt officials.

"You will be going out on the roads of South Africa as products of Mangaung. We urge you to be disciplined in your work, and carry out your duties as expected. As traffic officers, you will be caretakers of our roads," he said.
