RE: RULE 38 QUESTION: COLLECTION OF PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT DEBT

This letter is in response to the rule 38 questions by the VRYHEIDSFRONT PLUS:

1. What is debt owed by the Free State Provincial government to the Mangaung Metro?

Provincial Public Works R 993 714 207

- Electricity interest charge 1 July 2020 to end May 2021 is R 200 389 on a total ageing bill of R 236 749 379
- Mangaung total ageing debt of R 756 964 828 inclusive of interest of R 175 027 850
- 2. As on 1 June 2021, what is the amount owed to the Metro by the Free State Government?

Provincial Public Works R 993 714 207

- Electricity interest charge 1 July 2020 to end May 2021 is R 200 389 on a total ageing bill of R 236 749 379
- Mangaung total ageing debt of R 756 964 828 inclusive of interest of R 175 027 850
- 3. Are any steps being taken to collect the outstanding debt of the Free State Provincial government?

Mangaung Metropolitan Municipality has already started implementing full Credit Control and Debt Collection procedures to recover outstanding debts from customers to meet its financial commitments.

- A letter was sent to National Treasury dated 4 July 2018 in terms of Section 64 of the Municipal Finance Management Act to request assistance from National Treasury to recover the arrear

- debts from Provincial Public Works. No feedback has been received from National Treasury up until today.
- The municipality acknowledges payment of R19.5 million and R33 million received from your department on 15 March 2018 and 23 April 2018 respectively.
- Payment of approximately R 80.5 Million was received in July 2018.
- Several Meetings were held with Provincial Public Works throughout the course of the 2018 calendar year and several letters sent to request payment of outstanding monies.
- Final Letter of demand was sent to Public Works on 25 October 2018.
- Disconnection of Provincial Government Buildings was done on 8/9 November 2018 with a total outstanding debt adding to R 149 Million. Key buildings like OR Tambo, MMC Houses, Fidel Castro, etc. was not disconnected as per instruction from the Office of the City Manager.
- Some buildings have since been reconnected as per instruction from the Office of the City Manager.
- On 4 January 2019 payment of R 29 Million was received from Provincial Public Works.
- On 22 February 2019 payment of R 8.3 Million was received from Provincial Public Works.
- On 28 March 2019 payment of R 8.4 Million was received from Provincial Public Works.
- Payment of R 15 Million was made from 22 April 2019 from Provincial Public Works.
- Payment of R 15 Million was made from 23 May 2019 from Provincial Public Works.
- Payment of R 35 Million was made on 18 June 2019 from Provincial Public Works.

The municipality further acknowledges payments made by Provincial Public Works from July 2019 till to date.

The municipality further notes that the department has paid their current accounts to the amount of R 177 928 012,00 (01st April 2020 – 31st March 2021) as well arrears to the amount of R 149 091 747,21 from the month of April 2020 till March 2021 in terms of the arrangement as proposed by Public Works. The current billing of R 401 456 962,41 having a 44,32% payment rate on the current bill. However, there is still an outstanding balance due on the department's account to the amount of R 993 714 207 million (as at end of May 2021) and the department has failed to honour their arrangement.
